

By using iconography and color coding we created timelines that not only listed the key dates and events of the case, but also conveyed our client's story in a persuasive and memorable manner.

## Real Estate / Eminent Domain


When our client was forced to accept a utility easement across its property, their original plans for the site became useless.

We proposed a multimedia presentation to support their case. 



#### ITC

Our client had filed a complaint alleging patent infringement against a major manufacturer of touch-screen technology before the US International Trade Commission (ITC) and now had the difficult task of both educating the judge on the technology and proving infringement.








#### ITC







## White Collar Crime / Stock Option Backdating

The SEC alleged that the Company issued backdated stock options that contained a lower exercise price than the price of the common stock on the date the options were awarded. Additionally, the SEC alleged our client aided and abetted the company in its failure to keep accurate records of transactions and disposition of assets, specifically maintaining records reflecting the dates on which the committee authorized the Company's option grants.

Our demonstratives detailed the Company's stock option granting process and our client's duties with the Company. We argued that it was not our client's responsibility to maintain such records, thus he could not have aided and abetted. The court agreed.





#### Insurance

After ongoing, organized theft was discovered at an industrial gold plating operation, we were asked to assist the insured in preparing demonstratives that illustrated how the systematic crime took place. Our work showed where the material (gold) had been taken from the production process and detailed the volume stolen through logs and records.
